Joining the Team: Promoting Attachment, Family Well Being, Social and Emotional Development in Preschoolers

This workshop is designed to help childcare, preschool centres, and family-drop-in programs, provide spaces that are emotionally supportive for children and families experiencing heightened levels of stress and mental health concerns. The National Institute for Early Education Research notes that around twenty percent of children entering kindergarten lack the social and emotional skills they need to be successful there. Early Childhood Educators and facilitators of community based early childhood programs have the ability to help make a difference in these children's lives through supporting development of these skills and abilities. This workshop will discuss practical ways to increase social and emotional well-being in youngsters through: the setup of physical spaces, listening play, and group activities. Supportive and empathic ways to partner with parents when there are concerns about the emotional and social development of their children will also be explored.

HEALTH (Harnessing the Environment and Activity to Improve Target Behaviours and Mental Health)

A workshop designed to help provide spaces that are emotionally supportive for children and families. Focusing on practical ways to reduce unwanted behaviours and increase overall mental health in preschool aged children. The discussions will incorporate practical ways to support children from a variety of backgrounds and developmental levels.

Dr. Tamara Williams is a registered psychologist who has been working with and supporting children and their families for 10 yrs. She has worked in: Salt Lake City, Utah; Sydney, Nova Scotia; & in over ten different communities in the lower mainland. Inclusion is a difficult concept and an even more difficult reality. Early Childhood Educators may struggle with applying, adapting, and designing inclusion in their classroom. Sometimes this struggle comes from the feelings of helplessness, loneliness and a lack of self-confidence. These feelings are fueled by the lack of time, lack of resources, and mostly...stress. What if they would let go of stress? What if inclusion could morph from inclusion into a fun, imaginative and relaxed reality? This workshop will walk participants through a multitude of practical and theoretical aspects of inclusion that will try to shift some of the usual misconceptions and fears around this complex aspect of the ECCE everyday pedagogy.

*Dr. Annabella Cant is a professor in Early Childhood Education at Capilano University and sessional instructor of the Master's of Education in Imaginative Education at Simon Fraser University. Her newest publication (2017) is a book for all educators and parents – [Unswaddling Pedagogy](#). Annabella is also the associate director of the Imaginative Education Research Group, created by the globally recognized creator of the theory of Imaginative Education: Dr. Kieran Egan. She is also the initiator and editor-in-chief of the online journal: *Childhoods and Pedagogies*. She has been practicing ECCE since 1994; In 1999 she started opening her own early childhood centres in Europe, dedicated to children with very diverse backgrounds and abilities. She collaborated with a number of orphanages and organizations and welcomed all children, regardless of ability, ethnicity, or family competence. Today she is sharing the lessons she has learned from children. She is teaching a diversity of courses focused on inclusive practices, family and community, child development, etc. Her new pedagogical lens - the unswaddling pedagogy - is inspired and fueled by the stories she lived.*
