Integrating Children's Rights into Early Childhood Curriculum - Canadian Child Care Federation

Discover how to adopt a Children's Rights-Based Approach to Practice. Through engaging activities such as storytelling, role-playing, and creative projects, educators enable children to recognize and advocate for their rights. By incorporating these principles into our curriculum, Early Childhood Educators lay the foundation for a more compassionate and inclusive society, beginning in the formative years.

As Early Childhood Educators, embracing a Children's Rights-Based Approach to Practice is essential. In alignment with the <u>United Nations</u> Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), we must fulfill our responsibilities as duty bearers, while children take on the role of rights holders. Understanding this relationship empowers our programs and supports the children in our care. Upholding children's rights consists of two interconnected aspects; as duty bearers, we have obligations and accountability under the UNCRC to realize these rights. Meanwhile, rights-holders (the children) actively engage by asserting their rights from us, the duty bearers (Lundy, McEvoy, & Byrne, 2011). A practical way to foster this interactive approach is by incorporating rights-based elements into our daily curriculum.
